In implementation research, the word "intervention" can refer to two things:

- An evidence-based intervention  $\rightarrow$  the program, policy, practice, pill, etc., that affects patient outcomes.
- An implementation intervention  $\rightarrow$  manipulations to the *system* that help implement the EBI.

To avoid inevitable confusion, we typically refer to the latter as "strategies."

When implementing an EBI, multiple discrete strategies are typically used. Several taxonomies/lists of strategies exist in the literature, including by Bunger et al. (2017) and by Powell et al. (2015).
